Thunderbird Sailing Club Presents: Hiram Douglas Memorial Regatta

A one day Regatta, Sunday, November 5, 2006

A distance race on Sunday, 10 - 18 miles

Lake Thunderbird BoatHouse, Norman, Oklahoma

CLASSES: All boats 20 feet length on deck or greater are welcome. Boats shall register in either Spinnaker or Non-spinnaker, handicap fleets with handicapping being the current US Sailing Portsmouth Yardstick with wind correction factors.

RULES: The race will be governed by the Rules as defined in the 2005-2008 Racing Rules of Sailing, and CSSA Sailing Instructions with supplemental Local Appendix.

TROPHIES: Trophies will be presented to 1st - 3rd in each fleet. The traveling Trophy will be presented to the Skipper and Crew of the boat with the lowest corrected time in the largest fleet.

FACILITIES: Note: Ramp at Sailboat Point is Closed! Use the Indian Point Road, North Ramp, 1 mile north of BoatHouse Road at end of Indian Point Road. Courtesy docks adjacent to the BoatHouse.

DIRECTIONS: From the North: I-35 south to I-40, then east to Choctaw Road exit; Choctaw Road south to Alameda Street; east on Alameda to Lake Thunderbird State Park and until the road starts to enter the lake. Turn left (north) on Indian Point Road to the Regatta Site, which will be the first right (east) on BoatHouse Road.

From the South: I-35 north to State Highway 9, then east on S.H. 9 to 84th Avenue; north on 84th Ave. to Alameda Street; east on Alameda to Lake Thunderbird State Park and until the road starts to enter the lake. Turn left (north) on Indian Point Road to the Regatta site, which will be the first right (east) on BoatHouse Road.

Chesapeake BoatHouse Foundation and the Chesapeake BoatHouse

Mike will be our guest speaker at the October TSC meeting on Sat. 10/21/06

Mike Knopp has been a driving force behind the development of rowing in Oklahoma City since 1999 when he and wife Tempe, along with a core group of rowers, established the Oklahoma Association for Rowing (OAR). Since then, Mike has worked with the rowing community as well as civic and business leaders to establish the Chesapeake Boathouse and bring rowing to the forefront in downtown Oklahoma City.



A former assistant district attorney and later, an attorney for the Federal Aviation Administration, Mike left his law career in 2003 to become the coach of Oklahoma City University's newly established varsity rowing program and pursue development of rowing in Oklahoma City. In 2004, Mike staged OCU's first Head of the Oklahoma Centennial Regatta which drew hundreds of competitors and thousands of spectators from across the metro. The event became the most attended event in OCU history. Today, it is one of the region's largest regattas and draws national attention in the rowing community.

Both Mike and his wife began their rowing careers at Oklahoma State University where they helped build a competitive collegiate club program. After rowing at OSU, the couple continued competing in mixed double races while pursuing law and graduate degrees, while rowing undefeated for several years at regattas across the region. Mike also had the opportunity to row in Oxford, United Kingdom, while studying law.

After moving to Oklahoma City and establishing OAR, the Knopps developed a competitive juniors rowing program which attracted high school students from across the metro area and produced numerous gold-medal winning crews. Mike coached OCU and OU club crews while helping develop programs to introduce Oklahoma City area residents to the sport.

Today, Mike serves as both Head Coach for the OCU Stars Varsity Rowing Program and as executive director for the Oklahoma City Boathouse Foundation and Chesapeake Boathouse.

A Year in New England: Janie Davis

Meteorologists predicted astronomically high tides and spray from the ocean. The first time I heard the expression "astronomically" high tides I thought they were being a bit melodramatic. Turns out that they really mean high tides due to the full moon, an astronomical event! How was I supposed to know that being from Oklahoma, the land of the Harvest Moon?

It was a windy, cold, clear and, of course, full moon night when I drove out to Marblehead Neck (Massachusetts) last Friday to a beautiful little park surrounding the lighthouse. I often forget how beautiful that park, about eight miles from my home in Salem, truly is. The waves were crashing over the rocks, spraying the shore line. It looked like a scene from a movie.

I spent the summer sailing out around that park, leaving Marblehead Harbor and venturing about three to five miles offshore for Saturday races and regattas. There is a rock that is halfway between Boston and Gloucester aptly named Halfway Rock. It is amazing on a clear day to see downtown Boston while sailing upwind and to see Gloucester after rounding the offset mark with a perfect spinnaker set. One day this past summer it was so clear that you could see the entire coast of Massachusetts: Newburyport, Gloucester, Manchester By The Sea, Beverly, Salem, Marblehead, Boston and The South Shore, all the way to Cape Cod.

J/24 US4202 "Zot" was my ride for the summer. The boat is owned and mostly skippered by Frank McNamara who is lead counsel for Putnam Investments. Marblehead Racing Association coordinates racing from four yacht clubs: The Boston Yacht Club, Corinthian Yacht Club, the Eastern Yacht Club (all three on Marblehead Harbor) and Jubilee Yacht Club in Beverly. District 1 Fleet 28 is the local J/24 fleet. Zot sailed well enough to win the J/24 fleet for MRA and place 4th for the Fleet 28 championship. Three races are sailed every Saturday, two races every Wednesday, and several regattas are mixed and matched to determine each championship. Lots and lots of racing with trophies for each race, each day, each event and each series! Where does one store all that glassware? Frank is very gracious, generous and a meticulous boat owner that produced a highly competitive team for the whole season. My role was that of tactician and part time skipper. He and his wife, Lisa, and their three almost grown children are all very active in racing sailing and youth programs in the area. I am honored to have been on the boat, and have been asked to sign up for another season. At this point, Frank's fear is that I'll bring Earth Girls Are Easy to New England and race against him instead of with him!

My friend and long time crew mate Linda Bays came up for the J/24 Women's Championship in July. This event was a J/24 World's qualifier and attracted 21 teams from 3 countries to Marion, MA, and the Beverly Yacht Club. I have yet to figure out why the yacht clubs are not in the cities they are named for! I skippered the boat owned by the regatta organizer and the PRO, Nana and John Buckley, and while we did not finish well we enjoyed three days of varying conditions. Friends Linda and I have known over the years of women's sailing attended the event and it was nice to do a July regatta where the parties were on the beach and you had to wear fleece to the cookouts!

The New England PHRF championships where we placed third, the Marblehead Land's End NOOD regatta

where we got several daily awards but fell short of the big prize, the Around The Rocks J/24 Regatta, The Down East J/24 regatta in Maine (wow, what a clambake!) plus the series racing allowed me to log over 145 races from Memorial Day through September 10th. I've never logged so many races in one year, to say nothing of the shortened season. Understanding and seeing ocean current and the effects of tides has always been one of the great challenges for me in coastal racing. It makes a HUGE difference to do it 3-6 times per week rather than 6-10 times per year! I had the opportunity to compete for Boston Yacht Club in team racing, and many other experiences that made for an incredible year. I will be doing frostbite sailing in the Sonar fleet on an all women's team from mid-November through March. I'm sure that will test my foul weather gear, guts and courage to the limits! Can't wait to get started!

I hope I have enticed you enough that you will plan to come and sail on the North Shore! Bring your own boat, or I'll find you a ride, but I would love nothing more than to share the experience with more of you! We only had 3 days of 90 degree temperatures all summer, so come and escape and learn and enjoy! Let's toast a Dark 'n Stormy at the BYC next time you are in town! Remember, too, that Newport, RI, is only two hours away.
